Maths

This week in Maths our focus has been on money. We have looked at the following areas:





- Identifying, labelling and ordering coins
- Adding different coins together to reach a total amount.
- Working out which coins make an equivalent amount to one coin.
- Working out how much change they will receive.

The children have been using the partitioning and jotting method learnt during class to help find their answers.

English: We are learning lots of grammar,

<p>Statements Statements are sentences which tell you something, like a fact. They should contain a verb, a noun and usually end with a full stop. <i>Starfish live in the sea.</i></p> 	<p>Questions Questions are sentences that ask you something. They usually end with a question mark. <i>What is your favourite sea creature?</i></p> 
<p>Commands Commands are sentences that tell you to do something. They are found in instructions and start with an imperative verb (bossy word). <i>Play me a song.</i></p> 	<p>Exclamations An exclamation is a sentence beginning with 'What' or 'How'. It is a full sentence, including a verb, which ends with an exclamation mark. <i>What an amazing band they are!</i></p>
