English:

The Bishop of Southwark's Lent Call 2022

As part of our spring term Love Project, we are once again supporting the Southwark Diocese Lent Call. This year the Lent Call is asking us to support the work of Southwark Diocese to provide homes, shelter and food for those affected by the economic situation and natural disasters brought about by climate change in their four Link Dioceses in Zimbabwe and also the displaced in Beirut in their Link Diocese in Jerusalem.
