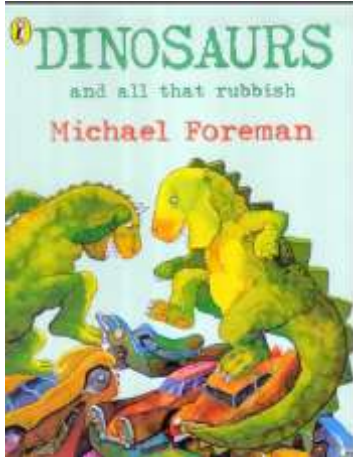




**English**

**Easter Garden**
