Monday was World Poetry Day! We enjoyed more poetry from Joseph Coelho. We learnt about onomatopoeia, a literary device in which a word is used to represent a sound. We thought about these words and what they were associated with, for example, buzz like a bee and roar like a lion and then put them together to make a short poem.

For 'Tadpole's Promise', we looked at the opening line 'where the willow meets the water' and used Monet's work to think of different nouns we could use to replace 'willow' and 'water'. Then we wrote a short descriptive piece concentrating on the use of adjectives and verbs.
