



Year 2 Homework Letter, Friday 4th March 2022

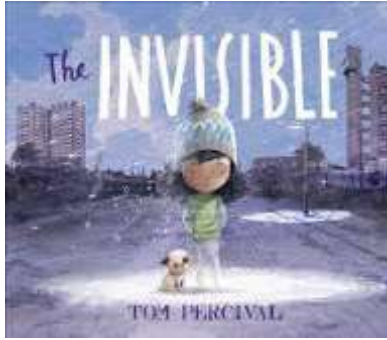
It's been a busy week in Year 2!

The gardens will be taken over to St Peter and St Paul's Church on Friday 1st April where they will be on display over the Easter period.
