### English, Maths and Reading.

### Easter Gardens

It has three essential features: a mound with at least one cross to represent Calvary; a stone or stone structure to suggest the empty tomb; and lots of live greenery and flowers. Easter Gardens should be brought into school on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> March so the Faith Team and Rev Phe can judge them on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March. They will then be displayed in the hall from Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> until Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March where there will be an opportunity for each class to visit the hall to look at the different creations. The winning entry will be announced in our Easter Service on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March. We welcome individual entries or joint entries with siblings or friends! The gardens will be taken over to St Peter and St Paul's Church on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April where they will be on display over the Easter period.
