English:

This week Year 3 continued to look at 'The Invisible' By Tom Percival. This book is being covered by every year group as part of our book week celebrations.

This week we looked at sequencing the story to prepare us for writing our own Invisible story. On Wednesday we planned our own story based on problems individuals across the world face on a daily basis. Finally, we wrote and then performed our narratives to the rest of the Year 3 class.

Maths:

Last week we learnt how to use the formal division method. This week we used this method to support our learning on fractions. We divided our whole quantity by the denominator to calculate 1 part of our fraction. Then using the formal multi-

plication method we multiplied our division answer by the numerator to find the answer to the question.
