### English

We finished our book 'Hidden Figures' this week and have had a focus on writing. We have focused on independent writing skills and grammar. This will continue into next week.

### Maths

We have focused on Roman Numerals this week. Specifically writing and reading roman numerals. To learn Roman numerals, know that I = 1, V = 5, X = 10, L = 50, C = 100, D = 500, and M = 1,000. If a symbol comes after another symbol, then you add it to the symbol before it. For example, VI = 6 since V = 5 and I = 1. If a symbol comes before another symbol, subtract it instead. For example IV is 4, it is one before 5.

### Sports Day

We had a fantastic day on Monday doing lots of sports and activities! The children took part in gymnastics, tennis and hockey! They loved working in groups to play a tournament and to create gymnastic routines!

### Easter Experience

The children loved taking part in the Easter experience at Reigate Park Church. The experience is an immersive and interactive play that the children are encouraged to join in with. They asked incredibly thoughtful questions to the actors.
