### English:

This week in English we have started work on our new book, *Black Dog* by Levi Pinfold. This week's learning was grammar focused. The children looked at sentence types: statement, question, exclamation and command, focusing on using the correct punctuation to correctly form the sentence. We also looked recapped on using apostrophes. We looked at how apostrophes are used for both contractions and for possession.

### Maths:

This week, we have continued to recap measurement. We focused particularly on adding and subtracting measurements using the formal written method. Some further children then challenged themselves to see if they could convert between measurements. Example: 42mm = 4cm and 2mm
