English

This week we started reading 'A Walk in London'. We began by going for a walk around the school and looking at key places and what happens there - then we used this information to write a short recount. Once we read the book, we talked about all the key landmarks in London and the children worked in groups to find out about each of the tourist attractions and then presented our facts to the class acting as tourist guides.

Maths

This week we are recalling what we know about statistics and time. We have:

- Use tally charts and pictograms to read data, enter our own data and answer tricky questions about it
- We made clocks focusing on the language we use to tell the time and we are now moving on reading time to the nearest 5 minutes.

This week's homework will be linked to our learning in Maths and will be on MyMaths.

Geography

This week we have been learning about Kenya in Africa. We found out that Kenya is located on the east coast of Africa. We looked at its surrounding ocean and countries that border it. We also found out about some interesting landmarks, languages spoken and what their flag looks like.
