Much of this work will be taught through high quality texts which afford the children a range of opportunities to explore concepts and the use of language through drama and role play in addition to extending their reading and writing skills. Guided Reading sessions will focus on the children's comprehension skills. We expect all children to read regularly at home and ask that yellow reading diaries are kept in school bags so they can be accessed at school and at home. We encourage the children to write about their reading in these books and we appreciate your comments about their progress.	<u>Maths</u> Place Value - The children learned how the represent numbers to 1,000 - a concept the will be reinforced and built upon as the children begin to explore numbers over 11. Addition and Subtraction - The children leaner adding and subtracting 15, 105 and 1005 to/from any 3-digit number. This tend they will be learning to do this with 4-dig numbers and adding and subtracting multiples of 1,000. Area - The children will be learning that area is the amount of space taken up by two-dimensional shape or surface and will exploring different ways of working out area of a shape. Multiplication and Division - The children will be recapping and learning the times tables up to multiples of 12.

<u>Wellbeing</u>

This year PE will be taught by myself and falls under the Wellbeing strand. Please ensure your child's PE kit is in school on Monday. As part of our Wellbeing curriculum the children will be learning about healthy friendships, identity and exploring why it is important to be part of a community. P4C will also play a central role as well as our outdoor learning about minibeasts; designing and making a bug hotel for them in our wildlife area!

<u>Arts</u>

In Art lessons, we begin the year with a focus on developing the children's drawing and painting skills, including studying the work of Picasso. In music we use the Charanga music programme and this term's units are Mamma Mia! In French, we will be consolidating the work done in Year 3, the children will also learn vocabulary concerning school and home and practice speaking and writing in class.

Science, Computing and Design Technology

During Science this term our topics will be **Sound and State of Matter**. The children will recognise that sounds are made through vibration. They will find patterns between the pitch of a sound and the features of the object that produced it. After half term, we will be learning about **States of Matter**. This will involve comparing and grouping materials according to whether they are solid, liquid or gas. In computing this term we will use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content.

<u>Hístory</u>

This term the children will be studying The Ancient Greeks. The children will learn when and where the civilisations of Ancient Greece took place, comparing the Greek alphabet to our own, and retelling the story of the Trojan Horse. After half term, we will be learning about ancient Egypt, its culture and its way of life.
