



Year 4 Autumn Term Newsletter



Welcome to Year 4! We hope you had a wonderful summer and the children are ready for an action-packed term. This half term, our value is **COMMUNITY**. After half term our value will be **PEACE**.

English

This year we will continue to focus on the application of accurate grammar and punctuation in reading and writing. Much of this work will be taught through high quality texts which afford the children a range of opportunities to explore concepts and the use of language through drama and role play in addition to extending their reading and writing skills. Guided Reading sessions will focus on the children's comprehension skills. We expect all children to read regularly at home and ask that yellow reading diaries are kept in school bags so they can be accessed at school and at home. We encourage the children to write about their reading in these books and we appreciate your comments about their progress.

Maths

Place Value - The children learned how to represent numbers to 1,000 - a concept that will be reinforced and built upon as the children begin to explore numbers over 1,000.
Addition and Subtraction - The children leaner adding and subtracting 1s, 10s and 100s to/from any 3-digit number. This term they will be learning to do this with 4-digit numbers and adding and subtracting multiples of 1,000.
Area - The children will be learning that area is the amount of space taken up by a two-dimensional shape or surface and will be exploring different ways of working out the area of a shape.
Multiplication and Division - The children will be recapping and learning the times-tables up to multiples of 12.

R.E

This will continue to be taught across KS2 on Tuesday afternoons. This term, the children will be learning about **Hinduism**, in particular, the daily practices and what life is like as a Hindu. After half term, we will be thinking about the concept of **Wisdom** and in the run up to Christmas, our unit is called **Jesus and the gift of Peace**.

Geography

During Geography lessons this term, we will be concentrating on, locating features on a world map, understanding/describing how the world has been represented on maps for different purposes and at different times, Prime Meridian and the International Date Line and time zones. After half term we will be looking into weather and climate and understanding the difference between them.

Homework

Homework will continue to be sent home on Friday and should be handed back in by the following Wednesday. It will consist of an English & Maths task and daily reading.

PPA

My weekly non-contact time will be on a Friday. The children will be taught by Mrs Boyle for half a day. This day will follow the usual routine.

High Ashurst - 21st to 23rd September 2022

Gates will be open at **7:45am**, the coach will arrive at **8am** and will be departing as soon as possible. The coach will be picking us up from High Ashurst at **4:30pm**, we anticipate being back by **approximately 5:15pm**. The children should wear jogging bottoms/leggings, t-shirt, sweatshirt/hoodie and trainer/walking shoes and a waterproof jacket. On each day, please send your child in with a (nut-free) packed lunch, water bottle and a spare set of clothes and trainers. These days will be long for the children, but very exciting!

Wellbeing

This year PE will be taught by myself and falls under the Wellbeing strand. Please ensure your child's PE kit is in school on Monday. School PE kit consists of navy blue shorts/tracksuit bottoms, yellow PE T-shirt, trainers and socks (girls should not wear tights during PE sessions). Please ensure all items are named. All jewellery should be removed before the session. During our PE lessons we will be concentrating on cross country, tag rugby and handball. As part of our Wellbeing curriculum the children will be learning about healthy friendships, identity and exploring why it is important to be part of a community. P4C will also play a central role as well as our outdoor learning about minibeasts; designing and making a bug hotel for them in our wildlife area!

Arts

In Art lessons, we begin the year with a focus on developing the children's drawing and painting skills, including studying the work of Picasso. In music we use the Charanga music programme and this term's units are Mamma Mia! In French, we will be consolidating the work done in Year 3, the children will also learn vocabulary concerning school and home and practice speaking and writing in class.

Science, Computing and Design Technology

During Science this term our topics will be **Sound and State of Matter**. The children will recognise that sounds are made through vibration. They will find patterns between the pitch of a sound and the features of the object that produced it. After half term, we will be learning about **States of Matter**. This will involve comparing and grouping materials according to whether they are solid, liquid or gas. In computing this term we will use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content.

History

This term the children will be studying The Ancient Greeks. The children will learn when and where the civilisations of Ancient Greece took place, comparing the Greek alphabet to our own, and retelling the story of the Trojan Horse. After half term, we will be learning about ancient Egypt, its culture and its way of life.
