



Year 6 Autumn Term Newsletter

Welcome to Year 6! I am glad to see the children ready for an action-packed and exciting term. I will be teaching in Year 6 alongside our Class Teaching Assistant Mr Pelusso. This half term, our value is **COMMUNITY**. During our time for Collective Worship, we will be thinking about how we are part of our local and wider community and what we can do to reach out and support them. After half term, our value will be **PEACE**.

<u>English</u>

Our English lessons will centre on a variety of high quality texts, which will enable the children to explore a vast range of genres and concepts. In addition to reading and writing, English will be taught through a range of different medias (drama, art and role play). Every day we will start our English lessons with specific areas of grammar and we will be linking these to our writing. There will be a big focus on handwriting to ensure that the children have excellent letter formation.

Please read regularly at home with your child as this is vitally important for the development of their reading and writing skills. Y6 children are asked to take ownership of their home reading and write their own diary comments each night.

Science, Computing and Design and Technology

This term in Science, we will be looking at 'Living Things and their Habitats'. This involves describing how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics. After half term, we will be looking at 'Evolution'. The children will be able to identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution. This term in Design & Technology joint with computing, we will focus on designing healthy meals.

PPA

On Wednesdays, I will be having my weekly non-contact time out of class for half a day rotating between mornings and afternoons. During this time, Mrs. Pelusso will take the class.

Mathematics

In Mathematics this half term we are concentrating on Number, Place Value and the four operations. It is very important that children feel confident in their knowledge of numbers and of their properties. Please feel free to come and speak to me if you need clarification on our methods of teaching any elements of Mathematics. We are also timetabling a daily session called Number Club. After lunch, the children have a 10-minute timetables test. To help them improve they should practise their times tables at home as much as possible. It is important that the children learn them 'off by heart' so that they can perform rapid recall of any question.

History and Geography

This year, Geography and History will be taught as two separate subjects.

Our main topic in History is the Vikings. We will develop children's knowledge and help them understand how this important group fits into the chronology of Britain. Through discussion and investigation, children will understand the terms 'invaders' and 'settlers' and discuss motivations for emigration. They will gain an historical insight into the lives of Vikings and British people.

In Geography, the children will be studying our local area and the changes it has seen during time. Finally, the children will be taught to use 4 and 6-figure grid references on OS Maps.

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This term the children will be learning about the Buddhist way of life by comparing it to the Christian faith. After half term, we will be revising the meaning of Christmas for Christians.

Arts

In Art this term, we will be improving on our drawing and painting skills. Our drawing unit will be based in our class Guided Reading book 'War Horse'. We will look carefully at some pictures of horses before drawing our own version, considering all of the details to include. After half term, we are going to focus on the artist 'Jackson Pollock'. Music this term will focus on learning the song 'I'll be there' and learning about Jazz. In French, we will be learning how to say actions in the first person and third person and learning about France.

<u> Wellbeing - P.E, P4C and PSHE</u>

On Wednesday afternoon the children will have PE. Please ensure children have the correct P.E kit: navy blue shorts/tracksuit bottoms and navy blue/white T-shirts. Please make sure all items of your child's P.E kit are named. If your child is unable to access a P.E lesson due to injury or illness, please write a note to let us know. Children will be required to remove earrings during P.E. P.E. kits should be brought to school on Monday and will be sent home on Friday for washing. We will continue to teach Philosophy for Children to facilitate critical and deeper thinking and provide opportunities for children to practise these skills across the curriculum. This term, we will be focusing on mutual respect and community cohesion. This will focus on diversity and migration. Additionally, we will focus on valuing Self and Others, particularly recognising different types of relationships, including those between acquaintances, friends, relatives and families. During our lessons in Wellbeing, we will be investigation the benefits of having pets; as well as, looking after our own school guinea pigs daily.
