Apologies for absence:

Mr Peluso thanked the Anti-Bullying Team for attending the first Teams Meeting of the year and welcomed everyone.

Item 1: What is bullying and do we consider ourselves to go to a good school?

We talked about bullying, what it is, and what we thought the role of an Anti-Bullying Ambassador should be. We decided that our roles are as follows:

- Bullying is a repeated action or a consistent negative action towards someone.
- Being unkind to people on a continuous basis.
- We discussed different types of bullying, including physical, emotional and cyber bullying, with specific examples being cited.
- The anti-bullying team came to the conclusion that we are indeed a good school and for the most part everyone treats each other with kindness and respect.
- The role of the Anti-Bullying team is to model good behaviour and stand up for our friends and colleagues.
- If someone approaches a team ambassador, it should be reported to a Teacher, TA, parent or anyone that is older than what they are.



Item 2: Events we can run:

We discussed what we could do to raise awareness during the school year on the subject of Anti-Bullying. The ideas we have come up with are as follows:

- Odd socks week paired with Christmas Jumper Day closer to Christmas.
- Create posters, which could be displayed around the school as well as a photograph of the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors so that the children all aware of who the members are.
- One Kind Word/Sentence.
- Sticking with our one kind word programme we talked about taking a unique spin on Valentine's Day/Friendship Day. All the children would write down a kind word, or phrase and on Valentine's Day the anti-bullying team would post all these notes to create a feel good factor within the school.

Item 3: Welcome Project:

- Everybody is welcome at Nutfield Church Primary School.
- We accept all races, religions and all families, regardless of those that have 2 dads or 2 mums or any other combination.
- We want to invite anybody and everybody to our school and we look forward to the day that anyone who wants to be a part of NCPS is welcome.
