This week we have begun to read the poem 'The Owl and the Pussycat'.

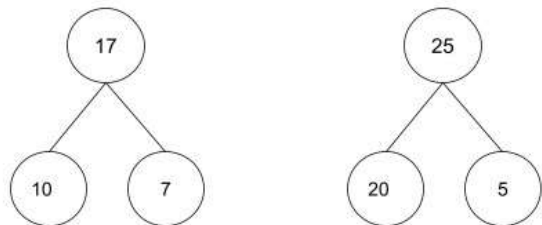
This is a popular poem by Edward Lear which was written for his niece.
