



Phonics

This week we have had a phonics review week. We learnt the phoneme ss and have also been revising previously learned phonemes and harder to read and spell words. Please can you remember to keep your child's reading log and books in their book bag every day. Many Thanks in advance.

Maths

This week in Maths we have enjoyed playing 'shops.' Mrs Summers and Mrs Brooks played the customers whilst the children took it in turns to play the shopkeeper. The children were asked to find real fruit and vegetables of varying weights and sizes. For example, we asked the children to find the largest pumpkin or the smallest brussel sprout. We also challenged the children to tell us how they knew it was the largest or the smallest. The children really enjoyed using the scales to check that they were correct with their choices.

Operation Christmas Child

As part of our 'Love Project' for the Autumn term we are asking families to support Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, a Christian international relief organisation. Through Operation Christmas Child, Samaritan's Purse aims to provide children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster or famine with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies. This year, in conjunction with Christ Church, we have provided each class with five Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes. We are asking for children to bring in a couple of items suitable for boys or girls between the ages of 5 and 9 to fill these boxes.
