# <u> Year R Homework Letter - Thursday 24th November</u>



#### Phonics

This week we have learnt the phonemes: ai, ee, igh, oa. These are also called vowel digraphs. A digraph is two letters which makes one sound.

Additionally we have also learnt the following 'harder to read and write words': was, her.

We did an individual phonic check with the children this week and we are so pleased with the progress they have made this term. We are looking forward to sharing more information when we meet at our Parents' and Carers' Evening next week.

## Líteracy: Cínderella

This week we have focused on a new fairytale: *Cinderella.* We read the story together and thought about the different characters and how they might be feeling at different points in the story. We also learnt new vocabulary such as 'wicked' and 'jealous.' As a class we re-told the story by correctly sequencing pictures and giving extra information about what was happening in each scene. In our enhanced provision, children have been making potions, just like the Fairy Godmother, in our 'mud kitchen' using pipettes, test tubes and coloured water. The children have also enjoyed making *Cinderella's slipper in the art room and magic wands,* using different materials such as card, sequins and pompoms. As it is Autumn, we thought we would make use of all the fallen leaves in the outside area by creating an outfit for Cinderella to wear while she was doing all her chores. In the 'home corner' children found a list of chores left by the 'Ugly Sisters' for them to complete. This included doing the washing and ironing! The children had to tick off each chore as it was completed. We have never seen the home corner look so tidy!

### Maths

In our maths lesson this week we have been learning about the number 4. In our Maths focus group, children used unfix blocks to make different arrangements of 4. They then used an ink pad to print these onto paper. In our enhanced provision, linked to our Cinderella theme, the children used unifix blocks to measure their feet and write down the measurement on a class chart. By the end when everyone has measure their feet, we will see whose foot will fit Cinderella's glass slipper!
