




# <u>Year 1 Homework Letter - Friday 3rd February 2023</u>

### English

During our Maths lessons this week we have explored addition by counting on from a given number within 20. We have learnt that it's more efficient to start with the greater number than smaller number. For example, when working out 1 + 13, it is quicker to add 1 to 13 than to add 13 to 1.
