Our Learning This Week

English

In English this week, we have continued exploring our current text, 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe' by C.S Lewis. As we draw towards the end of this story, the children were asked to appraise the text, giving their own opinions and justifications for their ideas. They then spent time creating a fantasy setting for a story of their own, designing and labelling their set. The children then moved on to innovate upon the original story plot by changing the setting and some of the characters in order to write their own version. We shall be continuing with this work next week until the children have completed their own stories inspired by 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'.

Maths

This week the children have continued learning about length and perimeter. They have focussed on calculating the perimeter of rectangles using the side lengths, rather than counting the squares. The children continued to look at rectilinear shapes but now focusing on finding missing side lengths. They were also able to identify equivalent sides and, after calculating any unknown lengths, annotate the shape, ensuring that every side was labelled. We finished the week introducing the children to how to calculate the perimeter of polygons.
