## <u>Maths</u>

During our Maths lessons this week we have used a number line to 50 and seen examples of number lines with different start and end point values, as well as number lines between zero and 50 or between multiples of 10. They have used their knowledge of counting to label number lines counting up in 1's before labelling number lines counting in 10s. Building on this, they have found the position of given numbers on unlabelled number lines.
