<u>English</u>

This week we have continued with the book called 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. We have identified verbs in the story and then in the past tense. They then wrote a set of instructions for how to help someone who is lost.



We also read several other stories containing the boy (Noah) from 'Lost and Found', e.g. 'How to Catch a Star', 'Up and Down' and 'The Way Back Home'.

During our Maths lessons this week we have focused on mass and volume. We began by holding objects to compare them, using the language of "heavier" or "lighter". We then used balance scales to check our comparisons and used a variety of non-standard units, such as cubes or bricks, to measure the mass of an object.
