## Happy and Safe Team (H&S)

Part of our work in school is around managing the building and premises. We are very fortunate to have an outstanding premises manager (Fred) who works alongside Mr Walker-Cheetham and myself to make sure all aspects are maintained, monitored and improved. Each term Fred, Mr Walker-Cheetham and I meet with our Chair of Governors (who is lead Governor for Health and Safety) to ensure our plans are followed and everything is safe. These meetings include reviews of policy, legislation, ensuring the cycle of checks and tests are complete and reviewing the site inspections. In a conversation with one child last week, I noticed he had a real interest in the practical nature of building and mending things.
