<u>English</u>

This week, we have continued to read 'The Bear and A Piano' by David Litchfield. We have been learning about the present and past tense this week and we have used what we have learnt to identify the past tense and then re-write sentences from the story in the present tense. We predicted the ending before finishing the story and afterwards we talked about our likes and dislikes and whether there were any unanswered questions from the ending.

Maths

This week began learning about time. This is a tricky concept and needs an understanding of fractions and counting in 5s. We have learnt:

- O'clock and half past
- Quarter past and quarter to
- Past the hour
