English:

This week Year 3 continued to look at our new book 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner. This week the children started by planning their innovated sequel following a new character who discovered the mysterious camera within the other flotsam at the beach. Their focus was on the use of fronted adverbials, noun phrases, use of preposition, and use of powerful verbs within their writing.

Maths:

This week we have turned our focus to time. Over the next two weeks we will continue to look at time within our maths lessons. As a class we will cover: telling the time in intervals of 5, in one minute intervals, using AM and PM; telling the time on an analogue clock; telling the time on a digital clock; duration of events and timing how long events last.
