Our learning this week

This week as part of our topic 'Sand and Sea' we have been learning about pirates. In our literacy lessons we have been reading the book 'The Night Pirates' by Peter Harris. The week began with the children finding a treasure map in the classroom. The children then followed the map which led them to the treasure. In our literacy focus group we wrote down the qualities that we would look for in a good pirate, such as being able to dig for gold, following treasure maps and not being scared of the sea and all the creatures that live in it. In our enhanced provision, we set up a 'walk the plank' activity for children to practice their gross motor skills, with the aim of not falling into the shark infested waters below! The children have been making pirate ships using straws, sails and kitchen sponges, they then made a water obstacle course to sail their pirate ships through. Our shop this week, became a beach shop selling inflatables, buckets, spades, sunglasses and windmills. It has been very popular! In our RE lessons this term we are looking at how Christians believe Jesus rescued people. We listened to the story of Zacchaeus, a tax collector who was very unpopular, but despite this Jesus still invited himself to dinner at Zacchaeus' house. We talked about how it might feel to be lonely and how Zacchaeus must have felt when Jesus reached out to him.

As per Miss Wood's newsletter, we will be asking Reception children to be dropped off at the gate after half term. This is in preparation for their transition to Year 1.
