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Phonícs

This week we began to look at phase 4 phonemes. We learnt some more about CCVC words and also the suffix ed which makes the /t/ sound. For example dropped, bumped, ripped.

Our learning this week

This term our topic is 'Sea and Sand.' We have continued reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' which the children have really enjoyed. This week in our enhanced provision children practiced their fine motor skills by making 'yucky sandwiches' to feed the seagulls. These consisted of mud and leaves. In the Arts and Crafts room we have been making 3D lighthouses using paper cups. In Literacy we wrote a postcard to *Mr* Grinling in his Lighthouse. We also learnt about diaries and wrote an entry from the perspective of Mr Grinling. In Maths we enjoyed completing a STEM activity. The children were challenged to build a bridge to balance 20 counting teddies on using only four lolly sticks and four paper cups. In the outside area, children made 'mermaid gardens' using coloured rice, shells and different plastic plants. They also created their own mermaids, by moulding mermaid tails out of playdoh onto playmobil figures.
