Online Safety

As part of our Science, Computing and Design and Technology Curriculum, the children in Key Stage 2 have learnt about Online Safety using Google's 'Be Internet Awesome' interactive lessons, game and puzzle. To make the most of the internet, children need to make smart decisions. Google's 'Be Internet Legends' curriculum empowers children to use the web safely and wisely, so they can be confident explorers of the online world. The children across the key stage have learnt about password safety (ensuring passwords are hard to guess), checking that information and websites are real and true and what to do if something happens online. These have been taught through the 5 fundamentals:

Be Internet Alert - Check It's For Real

Be Internet Secure - Protect Your Stuff

Be Internet Kind - Respect Each Other

Be Internet Brave - When in Doubt, Discuss!
