



<u>Year 4 Homework Letter - Friday 30th June 2023</u>

Our Learning This Week English

In English, the children have continued to our explore our current text, 'Westlandia'. We started the week by analysing the main character Wesley considering what he was like at the start of the story in comparison to the end. We then spent time creating story maps of the key moments from the text using fronted adverbials to show time and place. Using their story maps as the foundation the children then wrote complete paragraphs for each of their chosen moments. We then discussed that brochures can be written to inform and sometimes to persuade us to do something, the children have started planning their own report, published as a brochure to advertise 'Westlandia' to potential visitors.

<u>Maths</u>

This week, the children started their new topic of statistics. In Year 3, children learnt how to interpret and draw pictograms and bar charts to represent discrete data. They also learnt how to collect and represent data in a table. The children revised this learning before using charts to compare data in the next step. We then built on their previous learning by solving comparison, sum and difference problems using discrete data. The children were then introduced to line graphs for the first time. Most of the line graphs looked at changes of a variable, such as temperature, over time. The children then drew their own line graphs to represent continuous data. This was a short topic and so we finished the week with the end of module test.
