This is our last homework letter of the year! We have thoroughly enjoyed teaching your children and will miss them all. We wish you a restful summer!

Our learning this week

This week we have been reading the book 'A Day in the Life of a Doctor' and learning the features of an information text. We discussed the terms 'fiction' and 'non-fiction' and what they mean. The children looked at some examples of fiction and non-fiction and how we can tell the difference between the two. It was interesting to learn about all the important jobs doctors do and how they help us.

In our enhanced provision the children had fun making x-ray craft and doctor's kits using junk modelling. We have a supermarket in the role play area and the children enjoyed labelling food with price tags and writing shopping lists. We have been really impressed with the independent writing the children have produced during their free flow time. Outside, the children were encouraged to fish Numicon out of the water tray and create number bonds to 10. The children also had fun making playdough creations and curling up with a book in the reading tents.

In Maths we have been focusing on deepening the children's understanding with some of the concepts we have already covered. In particular we have recapped number bonds to 10, grouping, capacity and 3D shapes.
