It also gives us insight into their progress between now and their next assessment in the later stages of the autumn term.

K nowing this allows us to address any gaps promptly so your child can continue to make the best possible progress.

We have covered many of the basics, but our main focus this week has been on: relative clauses, parenthesis, personification and our uses of colons and semi-colons.

<u>Maths:</u> This week we have focused on place value to 10,000,000. The children of your 6 have focused on comparing numbers, writing numbers in their word form, the power of 10 (multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000), integers (rounding) and negative numbers.
