Year 2 Homework letter - Friday 29th September 2023




We have had a lovely week in Year 2 and have learnt all about the Jewish festival Rosh Hashanah in RE, the children loved trying some of the foods eaten during this festival.

<u>English</u>

This week have used fronted adverbials to write paragraphs about the story 'Jim and the Beanstalk'. We used phrases like 'in the morning', 'in the blink of an eye' and after a while' to retell the main events of the story. A lso we have been learning what a verb and an adverb are in its simplest form: a verb is an action or a doing word for example clap and adverbs are used to explain HOW that action might be performed – loudly – 'the children clapped loudly when their team won'.

<u>Maths</u>

This week we are have been counting in 10s and 1s and estimating numbers on a numberline, with increasing difficulty as the week has progressed.
