



<u>Year 5 Homework Letter - Friday 10th November</u>

<u>English</u>

In English this week, we have continued with the book 'The Lost Thing'. The children have been creating their own 'Lost Thing' out of paper and pipe cleaners and they have recapped using noun phrases to describe it. They have also learnt about modal verbs such as could, may and might to express the language of possibility. The children have been introduced to the subjunctive mood and used this to write formal letters. The subjunctive mood is used in formal writing to express wishes or suggestions and it uses the infinitive verb form. For example: 'I suggest he take him to the park'.

Maths

In Maths, the children learnt what square and cube numbers are as well revising multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000. The children have developed their knowledge by using place value charts to help them see how digits move to the left or right. For example:
