
English: This term we have continued to look at our book 'The Hidden Forest' by Jeannie Baker. So far this week, we have explored the various ways we can create fronted adverbials. To do this we looked at how adverbs, prepositions conjunctions, similes, words ending with -ed and words ending with -ing can be used. Fronted Adverbials are brilliant for when you want to make your writing a little more descriptive. They are best used when the specific place, time, or manner in which an action took place might be of interest or importance to the reader.
