Each year, Earth Hour encourages individuals, businesses, and governments around the world to take positive actions for the environment by switching off their lights for one designated hour. Concerned with tackling issues such as global warming, climate change, and the loss of biodiversity and natural habitats, Earth Hour is a non-profit organisation that operates out of Singapore to address these issues worldwide. The annual Earth Hour blackout is just a small part of the work that they do, and all of their efforts are aimed at creating wider environmental change and legislative action on issues that matter to the planet.
