

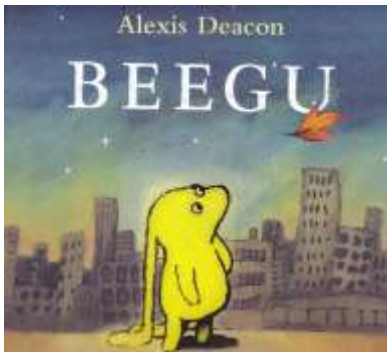


Year 1 Homework Letter - Friday 1st March 2024

English

This week we have continued using the book 'Beegu'. We discussed that I had been talking to Beegu, and she can only speak in 'Robot Talk', e.g. b-i-g (phonic segmenting) and the children tried to blend the words she said to make sense. Some words she said are 'real', some are 'nonsense'. Beegu said words like: Splag, jike, strum, like, flape, came, sprune, tail. We then created a simple rhyming poem with words like these:

She showed us a splag,
But we think she meant flag.
She told us a loke,
But we think she meant joke.

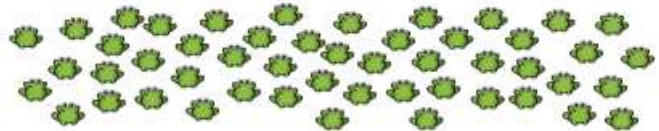
