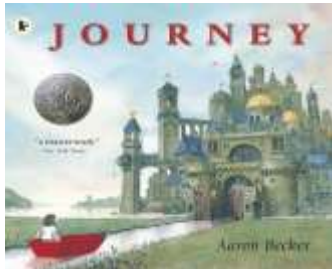




Year 1 Homework Letter – Friday 8th March 2024

English

This week in English as a school we have been looking at the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker. This wordless picture book is about a little girl who draws a magic door on her bedroom wall and goes on an adventure!



The children in Year 1 have been learning to describe a setting using a variety of adjectives and adverbs and creating speech bubbles to show what the characters might be saying.

- Circle all the numbers on the number line that are less than 23

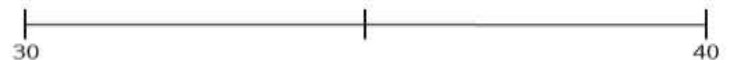


Circle all the numbers on the number line that are greater than 45

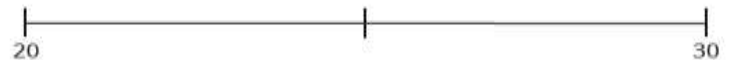


The children then estimated the positions of numbers on number lines up to 50:

Easter Gardens

Once again, St Peter and St Paul's Church are inviting the children to create an Easter Garden at home.
