




<u> Year 1 Homework Letter - Fríday 17th May 2024</u>




<u>Maths</u>

This week in Maths we have continued the work on our topic of 'Fractions'. We have looked at finding and recognising half of a quantity or shape. To find half of an object or shape, we need to split the

whole into two equal parts.



Towards the end of the week, we moved on to recognising and finding a quarter of a shape or object. To make quarters, we need to split the whole in four equal parts.



The children have all done very well in Maths.

<u>Honework</u>

The children should split everyday objects into halves and quarters (ie. cereal box, a ball...). They can draw pictures of the halves and quarters.

In preparation for our Victorian Day, we have looked at toys Victorian children used to have, and how they compare to modern day toys. The children have enjoyed this topic thoroughly!
