Our Learning This Week

<u>English</u>

In English, the children have explored the story of 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes through the medium of drama. They have used a variety of techniques including role play, improvisation, thought tracking, conscience alley and forum theatre in order to deepen their understanding of the story. The children really enjoyed working practically, allowing them to bring the text to life and gain new and different insights into it. At the end of each practical session the children wrote up what they had done reflecting on what they had learnt from their experiences. We also spent some time this week learning about sub-ordinate clauses and how they should be used to support a main clause.

<u>Maths</u>

This week, we have continued with our topic: 'Time'. The children recapped the relationships between a year, a month, a week and a day and the number of seconds in a minute and minutes in an hour, from Year 3. We then moved onto converting between analogue and 12-hour digital times, reinforcing and building on their learning in Year 3. The children were then introduced to writing 24-hour clock times and then reinforced their understanding of the 24-hour clock format by converting to 12-hour clock times and representing them on analogue clocks. We will conclude this topic next with an end of unit assessment before moving onto learn about shape.

This half term, the children have been learning how to play tennis and the Maypole dances.
