## Reading Comprehension:

The children have continued to focus on Reading comprehension this week in the penultimate week before their SATS. They have been focusing hard on comprehension techniques to answer a variety of question types.

We have looked at:

- Impression and evidence using statements
- Ordering of events
- Is it a fact or is it an opinion

The children have been working as pairs and teams to find the relevant information to support their answers. They have been looking at extracts from: WW2 journals, classic fairy tales, Charlie and the Chocolate factory, The BFG and non-fiction extracts.

#### Maths:

Our daily Maths lessons this week we have been recapping elements from the Spring and Autumn terms. The children have focused on: metric measurements and conversions, position, position, directions, translation and reflection of objects and perimeter and area.

In the afternoons our focus has moved toward arithmetic practise. This week we have continued to work on:
