Reports

Year R: The Reception Baseline report which was completed in the first few weeks in Reception and the end of year school report.

Year 1: The phonics check score as an additional letter or 'top sheet' and an end of year school report.

Year 2: The teacher assessments for the KS1 (now non-statutory) SATS as an additional letter or 'top sheet' and an end of year school report.

Year 3: End of year report

Year 4: The Multiplication Score on a letter or 'top sheet' and an end of year school report.

Year 5: End of year report

Year 6: End of year report (SATS results should be out by then. If they are they will be included as a 'top sheet'). If for any reason there is a delay, we will send on to you as soon as we receive them.

Sports day

Sports Day will take place on Thursday 27th June, weather permitting. The children will take part in a series of events, organised by Mr Bowen, in their school teams. The school gates will be open from 12.45pm and will promptly close

at 1.00pm with the main events starting at 1.20pm within the school grounds. We aim to finish and calculate the afternoon's winning team at 3pm, ready for the usual 3:15pm dismissal on the front playground.
