Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery. Begin to show accuracy and care when drawing

Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Make use of props and materials when role playing characters in narratives and stories.

Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and (when appropriate) try to move in time with music **Activities** – sewing fish, aquarium diorama, role play

White Rose Maths –

- To 20 and Beyond: Building numbers beyond 10, counting patterns beyond 10.

First, Then, now: Adding more, taking away.

Activities – Build and identify numbers to 20 using a range of resources, providing opportunities for the children to recognise that numbers 1-9 repeat after every full ten, using resources to add and subtract in meaningful contexts, spatial reasoning using jigsaws and puzzles and investigating how shapes can be combined and separated to make new shapes.

Write short sentences and phrases with words with known letter-sound correspondences sometimes using a capital letter and full stop. Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories etc. **Activities** – story maps, speech bubbles, postcards, story writing **Key texts** – Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch The Snail and the Whale, Rainbow Fish, Handa's Surprise

Give focused attention to what the teacher says, responding appropriately even when engaged in activity, and show an ability to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions Be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge. **Key texts** – The Most Magnificent Thing, The Dot,
