



Year 5 Homework Letter - Friday 5th July 2024


<u>English</u>

This week we have continued reading our final book of the year: 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold. The children are really enjoying this story and have impressed me with their interrogation of the key themes in the text and their understanding of and empathy for April, the central character. This week in our writing, we have considered the use of repeated words and phrases can add impact for the reader. We have also used the iPads to research some facts about polar bears. Did you know that a polar bear's skin is actually jet black?!

Maths

In Maths, we have finished our work on negative numbers. We have been using the analogy of a lift to help us visualize numbers less than zero and we have learnt that as we count through zero, the numbers continue to get smaller. So, -10 < -5 even though 10 > 5. We have also been considering a range of reasoning questions:
