Maths

In our maths lessons we have been using our number bonds to 10 to help us add 3 digits together. We have been using number lines to solve adding and subtraction problems.

Geography

We have learnt that the Earth is a spherical planet in space through using a globe and looking at images of the earth. The children have learnt that there are seven main land masses called continents and they are becoming very good at naming them all. We have learnt a song with actions to help reinforce this and they have all enjoyed singing along. We have identified each continent using world maps and have also identified the five main oceans. The children have also considered different ways of travelling suitable for both the air and sea.
