English:

This half term we are reading 'Flotsam'. This is a wordless text which enables the children to learn about the history of the camera through a fictional text. We have been researching how the camera has changed since its first invention and using this to write an chronological information report.

Maths:

For the first 2 weeks of term, we are learning about fractions. So far we have:

- Fraction and scales
- Fractions on a number line
- Equivalent fractions

We have now moved onto Mass and Capacity and so far we have learnt about:

- Using scales
- Measuring grams on a scale

Next unit is length and perimeter.

The Easter Gardens will then be displayed in the Southwark room where there will be an opportunity for each class to visit the hall to look at the different entries. The winning entry will be announced in Collective Worship on Wednesday 2nd April. We welcome individual entries or joint entries with siblings or friends! The gardens will be taken over to St Peter and St Paul's Church on Thursday 3rd April where they will be on display over the Easter period.
