Our Learning This Week

English

In English, the children have been focussing on reading and comprehension in preparation for their summer term assessments taking place next week. We have read a range of texts including poetry, fiction and non-fiction and responded to various question types. The key skill the children have been learning is to find evidence from the text to support their answers. This can involve using direct quotes or using their knowledge of the text to make predictions or infer what a character might be thinking or feeling. The children have been working really hard on this and I have every confidence that they will end Year 4 strong in their ability to comprehend that which they have read.

Maths

In Maths, the children have finished their final unit of Year 4 on 'Position and Direction'. Their end of unit tests produced a good set of results confirming their ability in this area of the Maths curriculum. We spent the remainder of the week revising all of the topics which will be included in their summer term Maths assessments taking place next week. For the remainder of the summer term, based on the results of assessments, I will be spending time going over any key areas of learning which need strengthening before leaving Year 4 ensuring they are in a strong position for the start of Year 5.

Homework

The English activities are to learn Summer 2 Week 4 spellings and to read for 15 minutes each evening. For Maths, the children must practise all of their times tables on Purple Mash.

Maypole

The children are learning how to Maypole dance with a performance being given at the Summer Garden Party on the Saturday 5th July. We are looking forward to showing you all we have learnt and the performance will no doubt be a special part of our Summer Garden Party. We are usually scheduled to perform in the first part of the afternoon; as soon as I have had this confirmed by the PTFA I will be sure to let you know.

PE

This half term the children are learning how to play rounders. We have spent time learning the rules of the game and focusing on the skill of bowling. The children have really enjoyed playing matches with one and other and growing in confidence in how to play the game. In the remaining weeks of this term we will continue practicing our Maypole dance and participating in athletics.
