Welcome back to a new school year! All the children have settled back in really well.

<u>English</u>

This week we have begun reading a story called 'Cave Baby'. The story of a naughty boy who lives in a cave, is about dreams and imagination. We have looked at some stone-age animals and used words to describe them. Once we read the story, we tried to sequence the events and we are now moving onto writing sentences for each part of the story. Next week we will be acting the story out to help us remember it. We talked about times when we had been naughty as children, if you managed to capture such a moment, I would love to have a photo to add to our display. These will be copied and then returned.

Reading books will be changed 3 times a week on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Please read with your child every evening if you are able for 10-15 minutes, I understand how busy everyone is, but it will be invaluable with regards to how quickly they progress with their reading. Please also practice the set spellings for this week on Purple Mash.

This week

The children have settled in well this week. They have understood the new routines of the classroom. We have been for an Autumn walk to see and meet the the chickens which the children have enjoyed. Each week a group of children will get to visit them and help look after them as part of our well being. As part of our emotional literacy, we have begun some mindfulness sessions with the children in the mornings and after lunch as well as starting to read some stories about our emotions. We will start to look at a different emotion each week to help the children truly understand how they are feeling.

Maths

This week we have been counting to 20 and back down to 0. We have been recognising and writing numbers. We have also practised ordering numbers to 20. We are really good at this already, in fact some children can order numbers to 50! For homework please practise counting from 0 to 20 and back again, and practise writing these numbers. I have also set related activities on Purple Mash.
