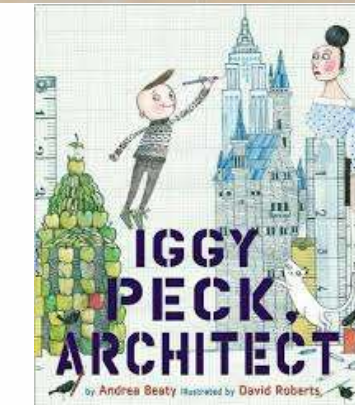
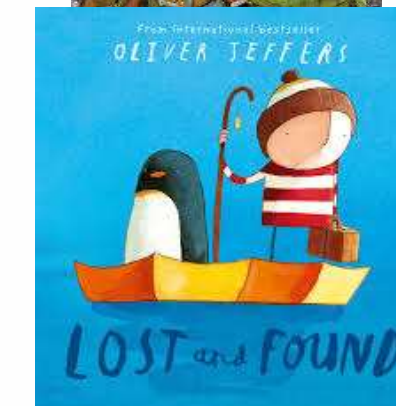
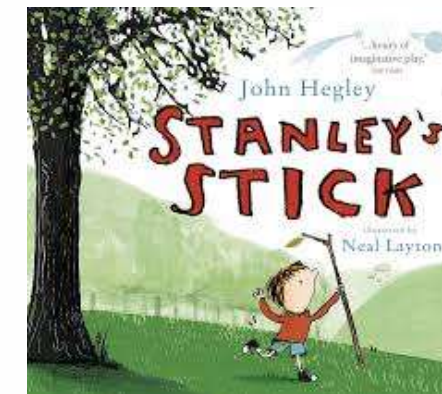
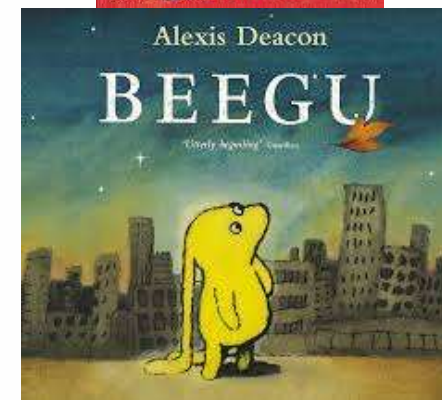
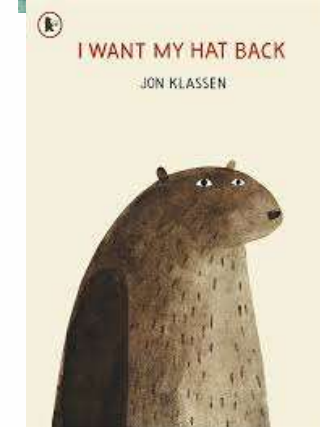
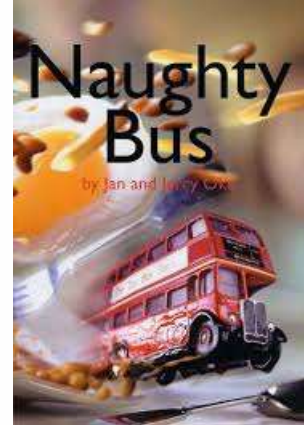
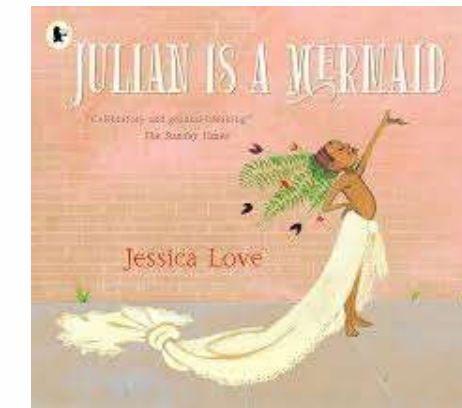
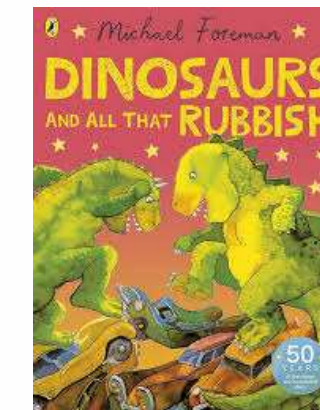
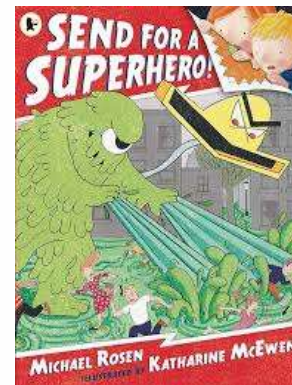
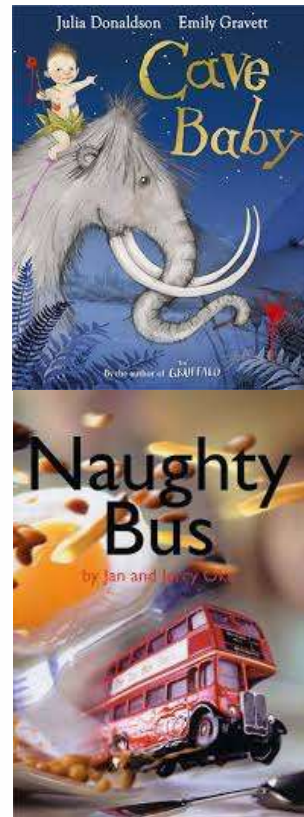
Transition From Reception

- We will slowly phase out continuous provision and free flow activities
 - We will have 3 break times a day – morning, lunch-time and afternoon
 - This term, there will be short, focused tasks at the pupils' desks as well as group work
 - The amount of focused time will gradually increase over the year to prepare them for the rest of their schooling
 - We will have lots of creativity and active learning stations
- Most afternoons this half term they will have the opportunity to complete an arts and craft activity

Curriculum - Maths

- Building up throughout the year up to 0-100
- Further exploring 2D and 3D shapes
- Further exploring measurement – length, mass, money and time

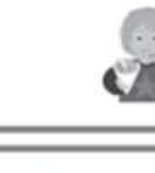
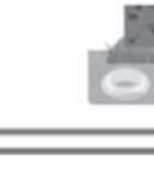
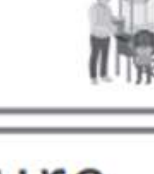
- We look at 12 Books across the year

- In November, we also introduce comprehension activities



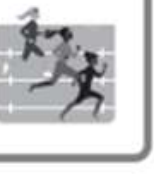
Curriculum – Phonics

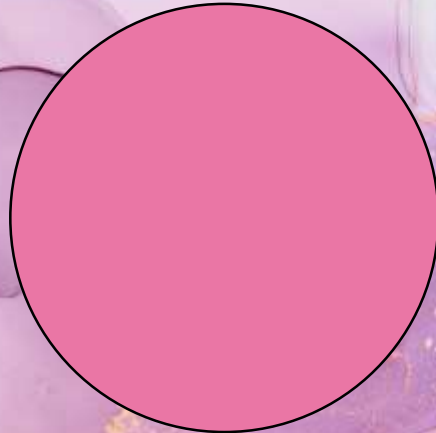
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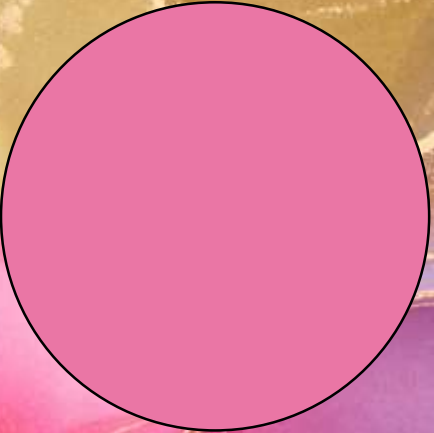
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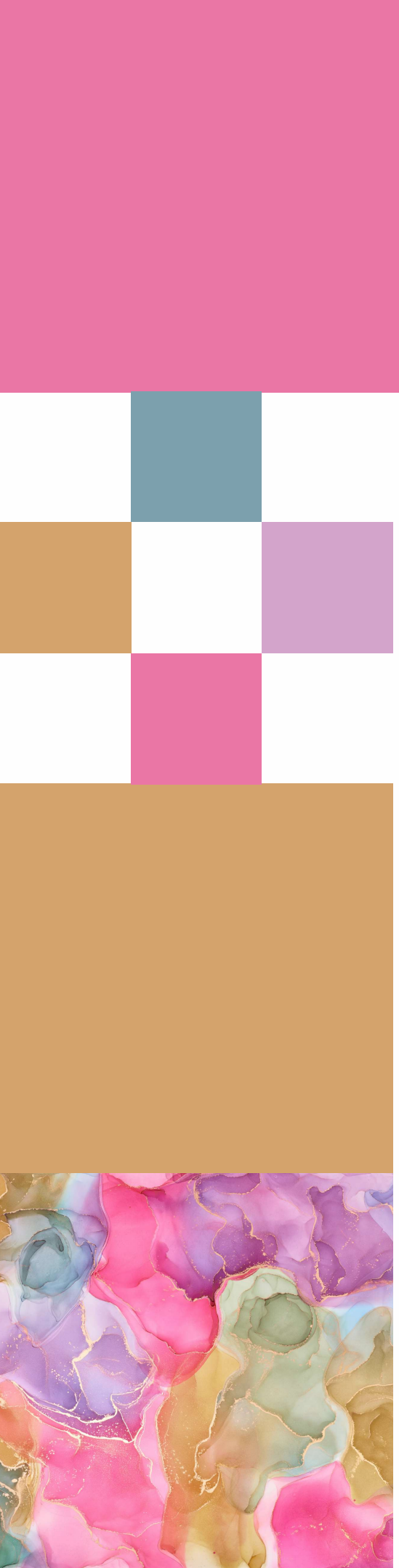




Reading Books will be changed up to 3 times a week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

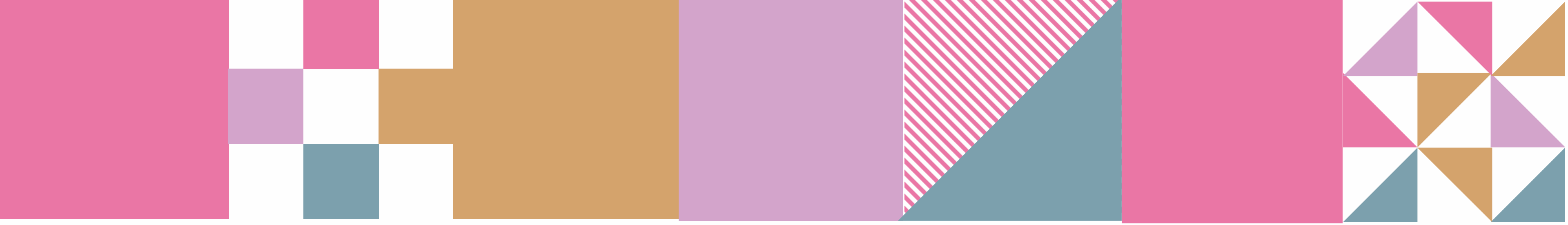
We suggest that (other than when reading), the reading book and record 'lives' in the children's bags.

- DT: structures, and healthy snacks

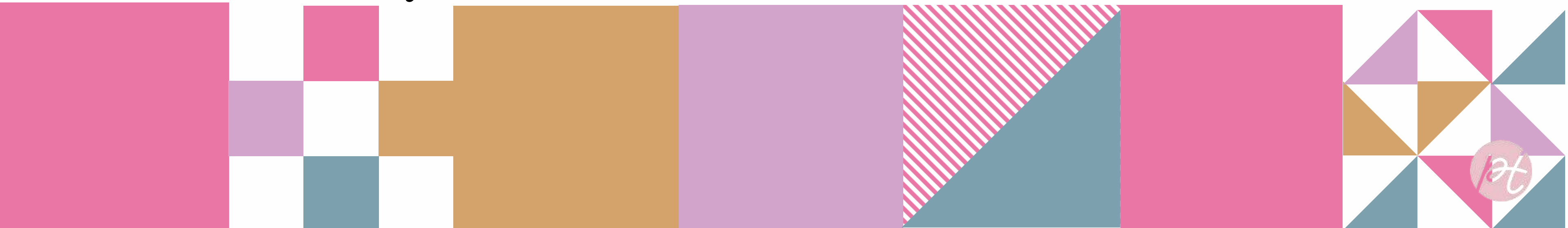
Curriculum – Creative Arts

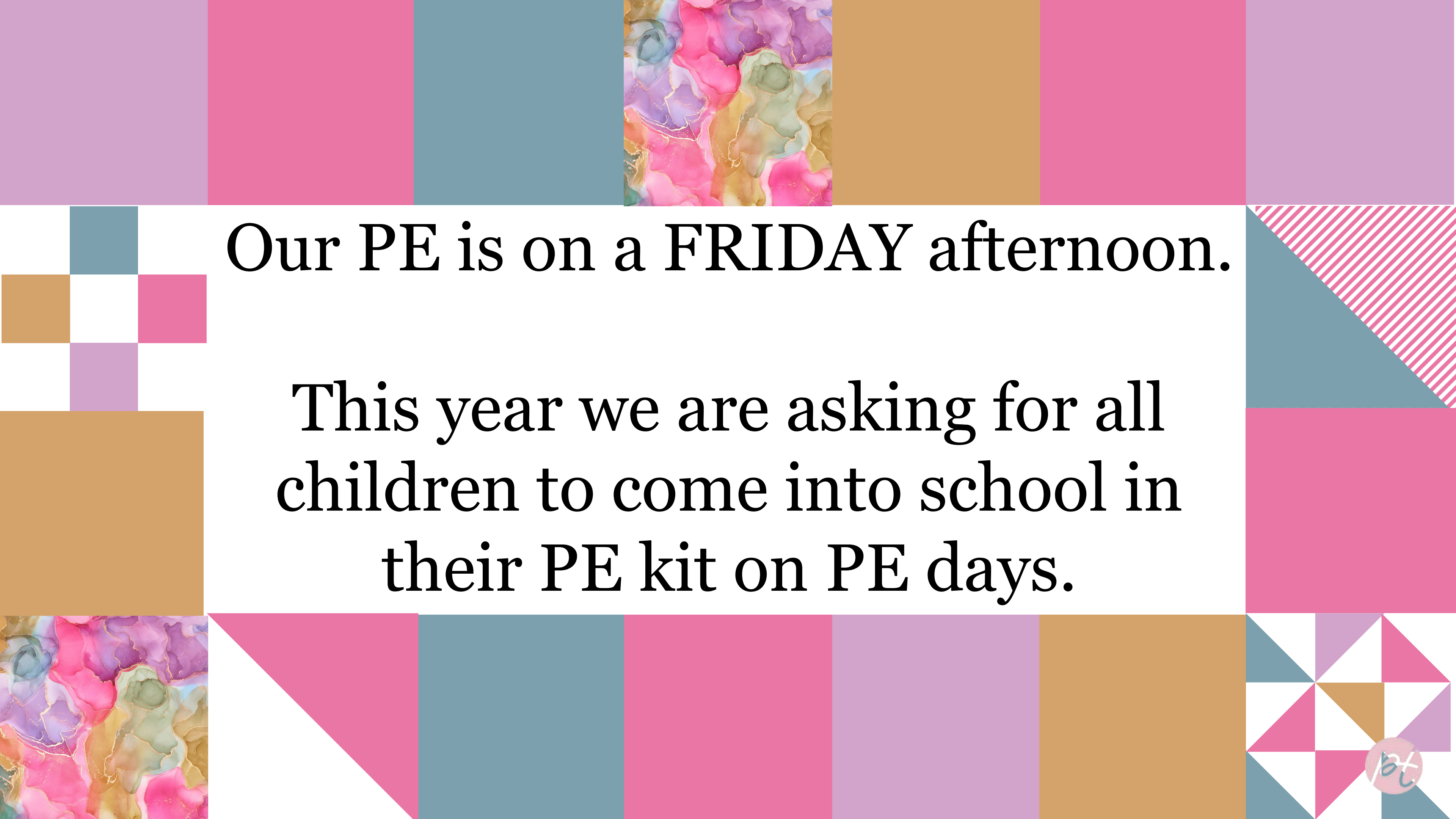
- Art: Piet Mondrian, LS Lowry, Clarice Cliff

Uniform

- Grey pinafore dress, skirt, shorts or trousers
- Yellow polo shirt, with the school logo
- Royal blue cardigan or royal blue sweatshirt, with the school logo
- White/grey socks or tights
- Black, brown or blue school shoes
- In the summer, blue/white checked dress
- Long hair should be tied back with small black, blue, brown, navy or white hair fastenings.

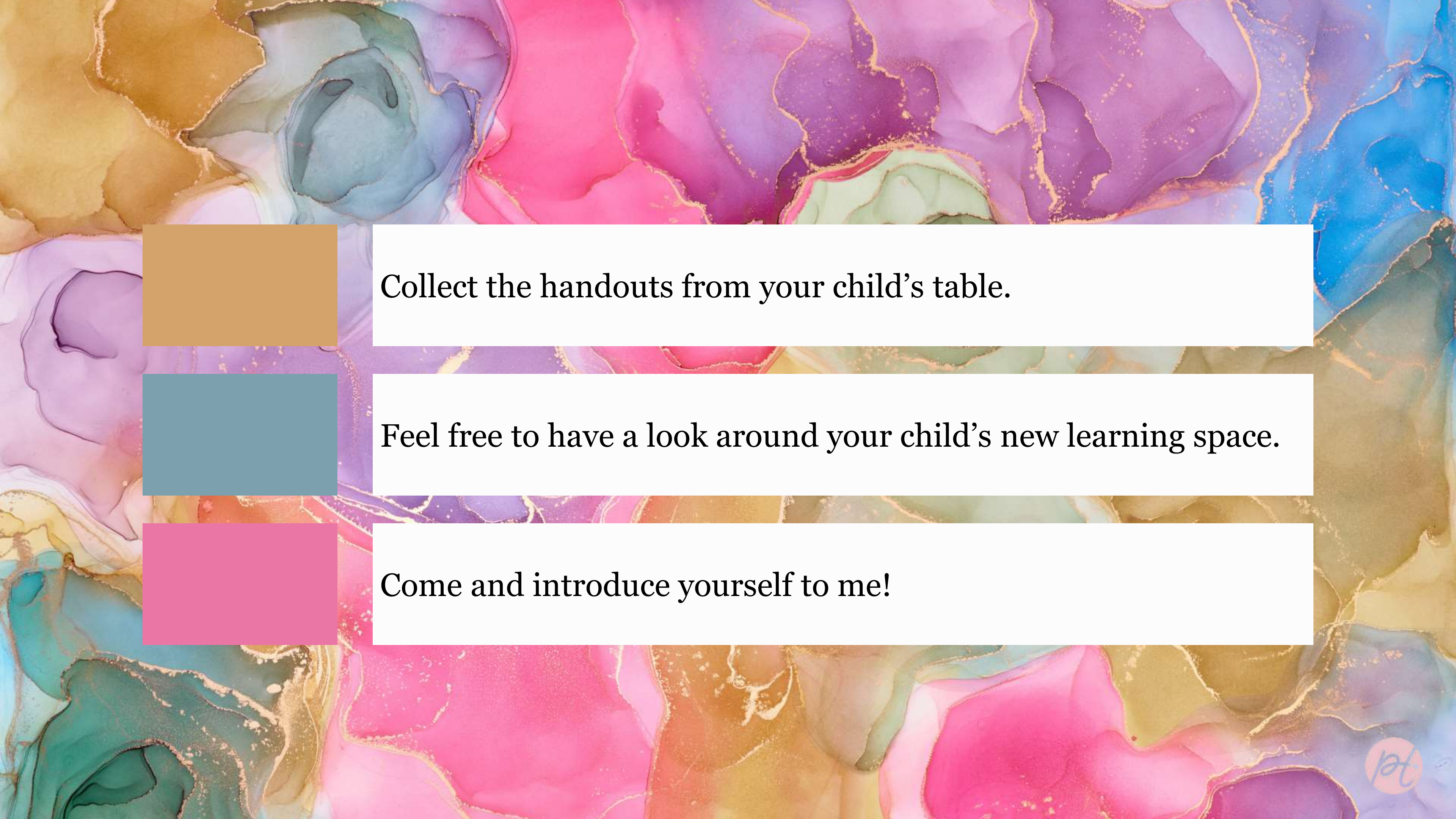
