Welcome to Year 2! This half term, our value is 'COMMUNITY.' In class and during Collective Worship we will be thinking about how we are all part of a community, that each of us is unique but that at Nutfield Church Primary we can build one team by supporting and caring for each other. After half term our value will be 'PEACE'.

English

Please read regularly at home with your child as this is vitally important for the development of their reading and writing skills. We appreciate your help to look after your child's reading record and ensure they are signed regularly and are kept in your child's book bag at all times. We are starting with 'The Journey Home,' a book which focuses on the importance of looking after the world we live in. The children will use innovation to change the story before finally inventing their own sequel. Our lessons will have a grammar focus, because this is a high priority within the end of year expectations.

Maths

During the Autumn term in our Maths lessons we will be focusing on the following areas:

- Number and place value: Partitioning numbers into tens and ones.
- Addition: Using an empty number line to add a one-digit number to a two-digit number
- Subtraction: Using an empty number line to subtract a one-digit number from a two-digit number
- Geometry: Properties of 2D and 3D shapes
- Multiplication: Counting forwards in twos, fives and tens to the 10th multiple
- Measurement: Length / Time / Money
- Statistics: Data handling
- Division: Represent division as sharing, groups and arrays
- Fractions: Finding $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of familiar shapes or sets of objects

Uniform

Please adhere to the school's uniform policy which can be found on the website. As the winter closes in, please ensure your child brings a named coat daily. Wellies are a must this year for our outdoor learning.

Science, Computing and Design Technology

Living Things and their Habitats will be our topic in Science throughout Autumn term. We will begin by investigating the characteristics of being human, then identify the differences between living things, dead things and things that have never been alive. We will also list the characteristics that are essential for keeping us alive.

In line with our Design and Technology lessons we will be developing bird feeders as a class using junk modelling to create a sturdy structure. After half term our focus will change to habitats. We will investigate a range of habitats and micro-habitats which are both local to us and in different parts of the world.

This half term during Computing we will be learning to use technology safely and respectfully. To support our Science curriculum we will be using internet search engines to retrieve information on animals habitats and food chains.

P.E

On Friday afternoon the children will have P.E. Please ensure children arrive in the correct P.E kit on this day: navy blue shorts/tracksuit bottoms and yellow/white T-shirts. Please make sure all items of your child's P.E kit are named. If your child is unable to access a P.E lesson due to injury or illness, please write a note to let us know. Please remember that earrings must not be worn during P.E. lessons and should be removed before school if necessary.

Teacher timetable

Miss Hancock will be teaching Year 2 on Monday and Tuesday and Mrs Boyle will be teaching on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

R.E

In R.E lessons we will be looking at why Christians make and keep promises to God. We have started the term by looking at promises the children have made and if these were hard to keep or not and why. We will then be moving onto looking at how promises are a sign of commitment before looking into the typed of promises made at different Christian celebrations such as weddings and Baptisms, looking at Jesus' baptism and the promises he made.

We will of course also be planning, preparing and practising for our Christmas Nativity!

Arts

During the term the children will be looking at the work of Ted Harrison and create their own interpretations of his work. After half term we will be linking art to our History topic: The Gunpowder Plot. The Children will be using clay to create their own miniature models of 'Big Ben'.

During our Music lessons the children will begin to listen & appraise. They will also be looking at the different styles, finding the pulse, recognising instruments and discussing other dimensions of music.

This term during French the children will cover basic greeting, names of colours and numbers.

Wellbeing

Over the year we will be following Jigsaw PSHE scheme which is sequential, there are six puzzles (units) starting with 'Being Me in My World' all of the learning and discussion will be answering the question 'Who am I and how do I fit?' We will be practising daily mindfulness sessions and the children will be introduced to a feeling thermometer which is a daily 'check in' with each child incorporating colours and emotions.

An important part of our Wellbeing learning in Year 2 is to look after Trinity Gardens. This term we will be harvesting, weeding and planting. Please can children have wellies in school and they may also bring in their own gardening gloves.

Geography

This half term the children will be covering the topic 'Is it really round?' This will involve children looking at the world to locate countries, continents and oceans. We will begin by producing a collaborative piece of art as visual stimuli for our learning.
