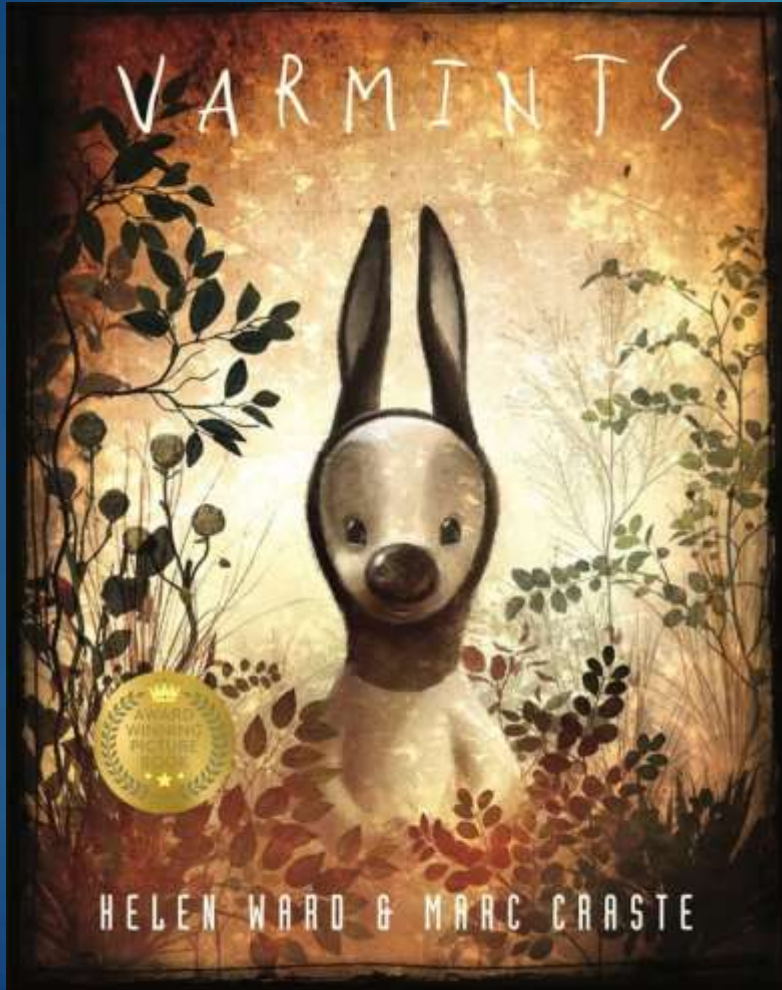

The Curriculum - Reading

- ▶ At Nutfield Church School, we want our pupils to love reading!
- ▶ We encourage our pupils to read every school day, for 15-20 minutes, or more, and it should be recorded in their reading record (please ensure these are in book bags every day for reading in class)
- ▶ Please sign their reading record when they read with you but in Years 3 and 4 we will start to encourage children to write neatly in their own logs
- ▶ Children who are still on an Oxford Reading level will read every day and work through the book bands, but we encourage children to read other books of their own at home too
- ▶ Once children reach the Lime level in Reading they become an Independent Reader and go and see Miss Woods to receive a 'Golden Sticker of Greatness'
- ▶ Children are then encouraged to read Lime+ books in school but please feel free to read as many other authors as you like at home!
- ▶ Some children will still read daily with an adult

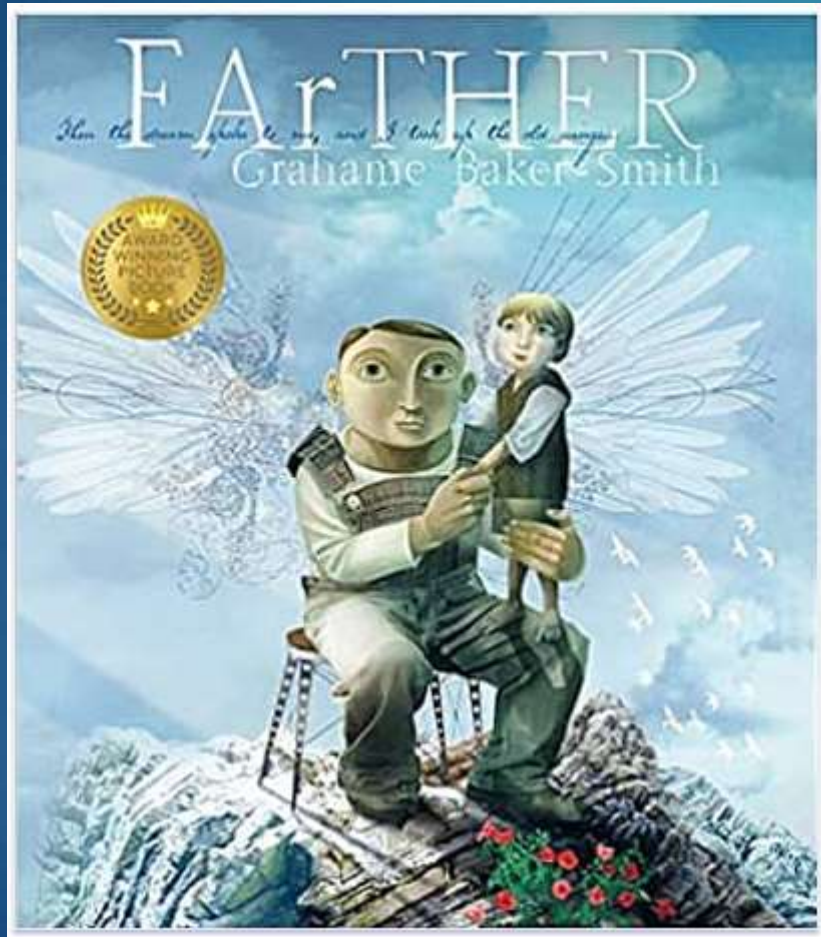

Emotional Literacy Programme



1. Morning Check-ins:

Children will begin each morning and afternoon with a brief check-in where students can share how they are feeling using the visual aid of a feelings thermometer.

2. Emotion Vocabulary Building:

Teachers will introduce new emotion words each week and discuss their meanings and expressions.

3. Mindfulness Activities:

Every morning and afternoon, there will be a short mindfulness exercise like deep breathing or guided imagery to help children manage stress and anxiety.

4. Calming Down Strategies:

Children will be taught specific techniques for calming down when they are feeling overwhelmed, such as counting to ten or taking a break, and each class will have a calm corner or a safe space.

Each class has a visual timetable and the children are encouraged to take ownership of this so that daily routines are embedded.

The Curriculum - Maths



Place Value - The children learned how to represent numbers to 1,000 – a concept that will be reinforced and built upon as the children begin to explore numbers over 1,000.

Addition and Subtraction - The children learn adding and subtracting 1s, 10s and 100s to/from any 3-digit number. This term they will be learning to do this with 4-digit numbers and adding and subtracting multiples of 1,000.

Area - The children will be learning that area is the amount of space taken up by a two-dimensional shape or surface and will be exploring different ways of working out the area of a shape.

Multiplication and Division – The children will be recapping and learning the times- tables up to multiples of 12.

Online Safety at Nutfield Church Primary

- ▶ In our school, we have a filtering and monitoring system which blocks key words and searches from coming up.
- ▶ If a child searches something they shouldn't an email will be sent to Mr Corlett who then investigates.
- ▶ Online Safety is taught throughout the Science, Computing and Design and Technology curriculum in all year groups.
- ▶ Key Stage 1 use Purple Mash's Online Safety scheme.
- ▶ Key Stage 2 use Google's 'Interland and Be Internet Kind' Schemes.

If you are concerned or worried about online safety, do come and see me!

DOs

- ▶ Talk to your child regularly about what they do online and on their phone. Who are they talking to and what about?
- ▶ Keep your computer/tablet in an area of the house that is easy to supervise i.e. where you will walk past every now and again.
- ▶ Reinforce the message of not talking to strangers, giving out any personal details and sending inappropriate words or images.
- ▶ Subscribe to your internet service provider's filter system.
- ▶ Build this relationship/practice now while it is relatively easy in preparation for when your child is a teenager!

DON'Ts

- ▶ Take an "it will never happen to us" attitude
- ▶ Allow your child to join social media sites where they are under the age limit (age limits exist for a reason!)

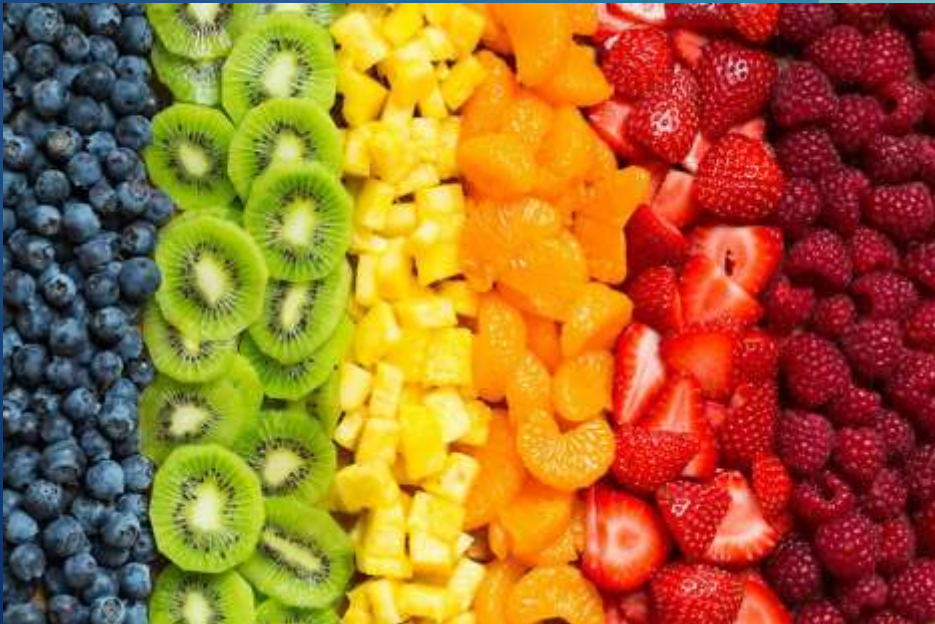
