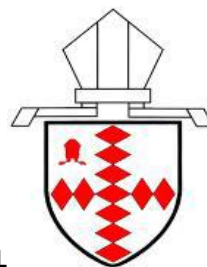

School Uniform Policy

The school colours are blue and yellow. Children should come to school in combinations of these colours, and be smartly dressed. Hair ties and bands are expected to be in school colours only. Haircuts are recommended to reflect a smart outlook on life. Long or short hair is fine. Excessive use of hair gel is discouraged.

Our school colours are blue and yellow. Pupils are expected to wear clothing that incorporates these colours and to present themselves in a smart and tidy manner. Hair accessories, such as ties and bands, should be in school colours only. Hairstyles should reflect a neat and well-groomed appearance; both long and short hair are acceptable.

Reception to Year 6:

- Grey pinafore dress or grey skirt
 - Grey school trousers (long or short)
 - Yellow polo shirt, with Nutfield Church Primary School logo
 - Royal blue fleece, cardigan or sweatshirt, with Nutfield Church Primary School logo
 - White/grey socks or tights
 - In the summer and in the first half of the Autumn term, blue/white checked dress

Shoes:

- Black, brown or blue shoes. Shoes for school should hard wearing and sensible, with low heels. Trainers, fashion shoes, boots or strappy sandals should not be worn.
 - Pupils should wear black, brown, or dark blue shoes that are durable, sensible, and suitable for school. Shoes should have low heels to ensure comfort and safety. Trainers, fashion shoes, boots, and strappy sandals are not permitted as part of the school uniform.

P.E. Kit:

- Yellow T-shirt, with Nutfield Church Primary School logo
 - Royal blue shorts
 - Plimsolls or trainers (football boots for clubs)
 - Drawstring P.E. bag with Nutfield Church Primary School logo

Hair Ties:

- Black, brown, yellow, white or blue hair ties.

Watches and jewellery:

- Watches may be worn but they should be named. Smart watches are not permitted.
- Children who have pierced ears may only wear studs or sleepers. These have to be removed by the child for P.E/games, unless a parent/carer has given written permission for them to be kept in during the lesson.

- All other items of jewellery should not be worn in school.

School Bag:

- Book bag with Nutfield Church Primary school logo.

Nutfield Church Primary School is sensitive to the needs of different cultures, races and religions, and are flexible and open to religious and cultural dress as part of school uniform.

Ordering Uniform

Uniform can be purchased online from **Price & Buckland**: price-buckland.co.uk. Uniform can be posted direct to a parent/carer's home address. Alternatively, uniform can be delivered directly to school free of charge.

Naming Uniform

All items of uniform should be labelled with the child's name. This helps reunite pupils with clothing. *The school does not have a lost property box*; this supports children in learning to look after their clothes and value their property. The school supports them in developing these values as much as required.

Second Hand Uniform

A sale of donated second-hand uniform is run by the PTFA approximately one per term.
